AREAS OF PRACTICE:

I specialize in gray market trademark litigation; criminal trial practice; juvenile court; general litigation, and appeals to all state and federal courts. I have conducted trademark litigation before the United States International Trade Commission in a 337 investigation from its commencement through the Federal Circuit Court of Appeals (*Gamut Trading v. U.S.I.T.C.*, 200 F3d 775 (1999)). In criminal law, I have tried murder, kidnapping, rape, aggravated child molestation, armed robbery, burglary, thefts, and many

misdemeanors including DUI. I have 23 reported opinions from the Georgia appellate courts. In all of those opinions, I was lead counsel, the brief writer and argued before the court if oral argument was necessary. I have raised and argued a constitutional issue before the Georgia Supreme Court which I then took to the U.S. Supreme Court on certiorari. It was denied. I was lead counsel in a series of lawsuits between a director/founder of CSN International (at the time, the largest privately held non-profit national radio network), and Calvary Chapel of Costa Mesa, California. The settlement resulted in the separation of CSN International from its prior affiliations and the continuation of its national radio network based in Twin Falls, Idaho.

I am a warrior. I am a litigator. I zealously advocate for clients in very difficult circumstances. I fight the lost cause. I don't scare and I am very good at what I do. I have superb research and writing skills. I have hundreds of hours of court experience. I am comfortable in the halls of Ivy and the highest courts of this land. Duties:

Carlson Al-Saudia, Ltd. was a general contractor doing business in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. We were a Saudi/American joint venture. Prince Saud bin Fahd bin Abdul Azziz was our partner. I was responsible for cost accounting on projects, profit/loss projections and vendor relations. I lived and worked in the middle of Riyadh and not an expat compound. I respect Islam. I am thoroughly familiar with life in a Muslim country and know how to behave myself in that part of the world.

Shortly after my coming to Saudi Arabia, Carlson Al Saudia began experiencing severe financial difficulties. This was due, in part, to poor management and, in part, to the collapse of oil revenues for the Kingdom. In turn, payments to contractors were delayed for months. This resulted in the eventual failure of the joint venture. I stayed there, working on a work out, until I was ordered to leave the country by the Carlson USA.
